Based on the short bits that we get to see, I couldn't get a good look at either. With just the overall look and size relationships I determined the models. The blue amp has a smaller distance above the badge indicating it is a 3 speaker cabinet. But the height is much smaller than a 3x15. That leads me to believe that it is a 3x12. The silver is shorter and narrower than the blue but I did not see the badge or the ports so I can't be sure of that one either. But it is definately a K100. The 2x12 CTS cabinet is a very nice bass rig for small venues. The 60 watts that the amp puts out

But the last time I saw her, she had generic (Marshall, etc) gear. The last bastian of Kustom, John Fogerty used his Kustom for 2 songs on his tour of a few years ago, but not when I saw him recently on his new album tour. It was fun when he told the story of his amp and guitar and played the amp as much as his guitar. He used the amp for "I've got a spell on you" and one other which I can't remember, with his Rickenbacker and the feedback he produced was just stellar. But I think it is up to us to keep those sparkly colors and black in out little corner of the world and hold the banner for Bud ourselves.
