the 3x12have one in black...nice cab on larger stage...you need to get the speakers working so they fill up the air space and then the cab really starts to impress..but in the house...I wasn't even pleased with it... I've played my rig on the local arena stage (a 9,000 seater) and it made a good visual statement and was plenty loud enough at volume with me about 15 ft out in front of it..if the silver naugha is in good shape then a 3x12 cab is a cool thing to have..if the white is faded gold, badly ragged etc. then a 3x12 is a big cab with a lot of bad looking landscape...I live in Charlotte NC, if the rigs are anywhere close by I'd be happy to go eyeball them in person for you.. I'm not in the market myself, although a local deal with no shipping on those big cabs is always a nice find..but I'm broke, so a safe bet I won't steal them from you......ET
