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The first question that needs to be asked is if the speaker cabinet is for bass, or guitar, (a give away for a bass cabinet would be a slotted port on the face) as a Eminence bass driver will handle a good amount more wattage than their average guitar driver.

I take a educated guess that is they where guitar drivers the least wattage that they would handle/be rated at would be 30 watts RMS, but no more than 50 watts.
